ASK YOUR * PASTORS

Tell me about your family. Did you grow up in South Dakota?

Pastor A: I grew up the youngest of two children. I have an older brother, Chris. We moved around a bit when I was young because my dad was a pastor. I was born in Kansas City, Missouri. We lived about 100 miles away from Kansas City in Trenton, Missouri until I was 2. We then moved to Omaha, Nebraska and lived there until I was almost 7 when we moved to Naperville, Illinois, a suburb of Chicago. My family lived there until I was 22. While we lived in the Chicago area, my mom was a teacher. She decided to go back to school, got her master's degree in education, and then went on to earn her Ph.D. She became a professor of education for the rest of her career. From the Chicago area, my parents moved to Westlake, OH. My brother stayed in the Chicago area and raised his two sons there. I moved around a bit in my early 20's as I pursued careers in Youth Ministry and music. Most of those moves were between Ohio and Minnesota where I attended Concordia University in St. Paul. In 2001, I married Joel Pakan. We have lived in Wisconsin, Texas, Minnesota, Louisiana, Pennsylvania, Colorado, and now South Dakota.

Pastor E: I grew up in Brookings with my parents and my 2 younger siblings. My grandparents lived within biking distance of our house and were involved in my every day life growing up. I stayed in South Dakota through college and then ended up accepting a job in Denver where I went to seminary. I moved back to South Dakota to Madison for my first call in the beginning of 2009. Nick and I got married in 2011 and we have Finn who is now 8 and Jack who is now 5.

What's your favorite Bible verse and why?

Pastor A: This is a tough question. There are so many that speak to my heart in different ways at different times in my life. Right now, 1John 3:16-18 is an important, everyday verse to me. Here's what it says, "We know love by this, that he laid down his life for us— and we ought to lay down our lives for one another. How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help? Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth

and action." This is an important reminder to me of two things. First: God has loved us enough to send Jesus – who lived and died and rose again -so that we could be forgiven, know real love, and have an abundant life here in this life and in the life to come. We are deeply loved by our Triune God who will never let us go. Second: Because of this deep love that God has for us, we are called to share that love. Not just in talking a good game about how we should love our neighbor, but in actually doing the work of caring for those in need. We are to use our hands, feet, and resources to care for this world that God so loves. It's a daily reminder of our calling. It's that nudge that I need to remember to reach out beyond my own comfort zone and care for my neighbor with the love of Christ.

Pastor E: I would answer this question differently in different seasons of my life... and it's hard to narrow it down to one. A consistent favorite in my life has been Isaiah 43:1 -2. It says: "But now thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you." First, it reminds me of my baptism-that I am claimed by God no matter what. My name is beloved child of God and I am God's. I have a piece of artwork with this verse on it- and especially in some of the harder times in my life, I have hung on tightly to the promise that God is with me-I am not alone- and the hard stuff will not completely pull me under.

There are lots of ways to be involved at BLC and SRLC. As you read through the newsletter this month, look for ways you can jump back into ministry opportunities.


Maybe you can try something new. Maybe you'd been taking a break from one and are ready to get back in. Maybe you are excited to get back to participating in something you love!



The volunteer will take these back to Fred Assam and will drop them off. Fred Assam then distributes them amongst the Brandon Valley Schools.

The Backpack Program ensures that children who rely on school meals do not go hungry over the weekend so they can return to school on Monday ready to learn. The backpacks are filled with non-perishable ingredients that provide at least three nutritious meals.


The Nursery
